**Qualifying Beneficiary Organisation: I Learn to Live – Ngifundela Ukuphila**

**1. Methodology**

The information in support of the measurement criteria, in 2 below was collected and evaluated during February 2019.

These criteria are based on the measurement principles as contained in Statement 500, of Code Series 500, of the Dti Broad-based BEE Codes of Good Practice, Gazetted October 2013.

**2. Measurement Criteria**

The following was measured:

- i) the nature of the organisation's activities;
- ii) the end-beneficiaries of its work, ie, the people who are it's target population group/s, and that directly benefit from it's activities;
- iii) the percentage of these end-beneficiaries who are broadly defined as 'Black'.

**3. Evaluation and outcome**

- i) Organisation's activities

The evaluation of I Learn to Live – Ngifundela Ukuphila has established that the organization meets with the requirements of a "beneficiary organization".

I Learn to Live – Ngifundela Ukuphila is a Non-Profit Organisation providing service in KwaZulu-Natal since 2010.

Their aim is to invest in the lives of school children and unemployed youth in a holistic manner to help them get the best out of the Education system and ultimately the work place and to create a sense of dignity and self-reliance in themselves and their families.

Such activities fall within the scope of the definition in the Dti's B-BBEE Codes for a qualifying socio-economic development programme. Further, these activities facilitate the sustainable access of the end-beneficiaries, as described in iii) below, to the economy of the country.

ii) Community served and end-beneficiaries

The institution is based outside Empangeni, KwaZulu-Natal, and primarily serves the local community.

iii) Percentage of end-beneficiaries broadly defined as 'Black' South African Citizens

The population group profile of the school at the date of measurement was:

Black South African	100%

Based on this profile, the target of 75% of end-beneficiaries being broadly defined Black South African citizens (African, Indian, Coloured, Chinese South Africans by birth or descent) has been exceeded.

As such, **100%** of the value any qualifying contributions made to I Learn to Live- Ngifundela Ukuphila is recognizable in terms of the B-BBEE Codes.
